



FAMILY GAME NIGHT: VIDEO CHAT EDITION

Supplies: Computer with video chat (Zoom, FaceTime, Skype, etc.)

Directions:

1. Come together as a family and choose another family you'd like to video chat with. Arrange a date and time that works for everyone for this week's family game night.
2. Choose a video-friendly game to play together from the list below! Team up either family vs. family, kids vs. parents, or boys vs. girls.
 - a. **Charades:** Teams take turns acting out either people, places, or things using only hand motions.
 - b. **Pictionary:** Teams take turns drawing (either on a large piece of paper visible on screen or using Zoom's draw feature) an item while the other team guesses.
 - c. **Spot the Difference:** Choose one player's room to stare at for 1 minute, noting everything in the room and where it's placed. Then have that player turn their video off, remove one item in the room, and then turn their video back on. The other players have to try and remember which item is missing.
 - d. **Categories:** All teams decide together on a category like candy, sports, movies, etc. Taking turns, each team has 60 seconds to name as many items as they can within that category. Whoever names the most wins!
 - e. **Scavenger Hunt:** Playing either individually or as teams, one person is the host and names off items for each team to run and retrieve. For example, "The first person to bring me an ice cube wins!" or "The first person to bring me a tennis shoe wins!"

TALKING POINTS

Get together and talk about how this game(s) helps us think about this week's Bible story.

- How did it feel to spend some time with friends tonight?
- How do you think Elijah felt being alone in the wilderness for so long?
- How did God take care of Elijah? How does God take care of you?
- Do you think God is with you when you're alone, too? How do you know?
