Where we are in the Bible

We will be looking at I Corinthians 13 this week. This is a very interesting passage as the Apostle Paul seems to interrupt his discussion on spiritual gifts to interject his thoughts on the priority of love! And then as the chapter draws to a conclusion Paul speaks of the limits to our gifts and even our knowledge during our time in this world. In verse 9 he notes that our current knowledge is limited and illustrates his point in verse 12 by comparing our current knowledge to a poor reflection in a mirror. It is a reminder to us today that we cannot comprehend and know God completely in this life. His ways are not our ways and any attempt to fully grasp an ungraspable God will fall short.
